The Student Center Operations and Event Services Office will not be providing training on the layout of Web Pages, training in the use of HTML or extensive training on the use of FTP. You or your club 'webster' should plan to attend a seminar, surf the web, or read a book to find information about designing and constructing World Wide Web pages. Below is a listing of sources you should refer to that will help you.

FTP:

We recommend using any FTP client to send files to your web account. However, from your VAX account, you may FTP files by typing the following at the \$ prompt: `ftp club.ccsu.edu` At this point you will type "log" to log into your account. You will be prompted for your account name (NT Username) and then your password. You should then be logged in to the folder where all of your .HTML code should be uploaded. If not, type the following at the server prompt: `club.ccsu.edu> cd/yourfolder` (see reverse for your folder name).

Upload data, graphics etc by typing at the prompt: `club.ccsu.edu> put fileonmymachine fileonclubmachine` where fileonmymachine is the name of the file on your computer that you want to upload to the web, and fileonclubmachine is the name that you want to assign to the file that you want to be served from the web.

Log out of club.ccsu.edu by typing at the prompt: `club.ccsu.edu> exit`

Club pages can also be managed by FrontPage. Search for your page on club.ccsu.edu and enter your NT username and password.
