

## TechRepublic's HTML cheat sheet

<code>&lt;HTML&gt;&lt;/HTML&gt;</code>	Begins and ends an HTML document.
<code>&lt;HEAD&gt;&lt;/HEAD&gt;</code>	Encloses items in an HTML document head.
<code>&lt;META&gt;</code>	Provides extra information about an HTML document.
<code>&lt;TITLE&gt;&lt;/TITLE&gt;</code>	Displays the document's title. The title is displayed on the browser title bar.
<code>&lt;BODY&gt;&lt;/BODY&gt;</code>	Encloses the main structure of the HTML document, such as text and images.
<code>&lt;FRAMESET&gt;&lt;/FRAMESET&gt;</code>	Replaces the <code>&lt;BODY&gt;</code> tag with frames. Framesets can be used within one another.
<code>&lt;FRAME&gt;</code>	A specific frame within a frameset.
<code>&lt;NOFRAMES&gt;&lt;/NOFRAMES&gt;</code>	If a browser does not support frames, it refers to the <code>NOFRAMES</code> tag. The <code>&lt;BODY&gt;</code> tag is used within the <code>NOFRAMES</code> tag for alternate content.
<code>&lt;ADDRESS&gt;text&lt;/ADDRESS&gt;</code>	Includes the text address at the base of the browser.
<code>&lt;A HREF="url"&gt;text&lt;/A&gt;</code>	Anchor to text for a URL. Click the text to visit the URL. Also known as a link. To use e-mail addresses, replace the URL with <a href="mailto:user@address.com">mailto:user@address.com</a> .
<code>&lt;A NAME="name"&gt;text&lt;/NAME&gt;</code>	Creates a target within an HTML document.
<code>&lt;H1&gt;&lt;/H1&gt; ... &lt;H6&gt;&lt;/H6&gt;</code>	Creates headings that can be used in HTML documents. Number goes from 1-6.
<code>ID="name"</code>	Inserted into any HTML tag, allows an item to be individually recognized by a browser and to be formatted using style sheets.
<code>CLASS="name"</code>	Inserted into any HTML tag, allows a tag to belong to a specific class that can be formatted by style sheets.
<code>&lt;OL&gt;&lt;/OL&gt;</code>	Ordered list.
<code>&lt;UL&gt;&lt;/UL&gt;</code>	Unordered list.
<code>&lt;DL&gt;&lt;/DL&gt;</code>	List of words and definitions.

<b>&lt;LI&gt;&lt;/LI&gt;</b>	Defines individual items in ordered and unordered lists.
<b>&lt;DT&gt;&lt;/DT&gt;</b>	Used for the word that is being defined. Used in <DL> tags.
<b>&lt;DD&gt;&lt;/DD&gt;</b>	Used for the definition of a word. Used in <DL> tags.
<b>VALUE="number"</b>	Sets the value in a ordered list. Used within the <LI> tags.
<b>&lt;STYLE&gt;</b>	Inserts a style sheet.
<b>&lt;SCRIPT&gt;</b>	Inserts a script, such as VBSCRIPT or JAVASCRIPT, into a document.
<b>&lt;LINK&gt;</b>	Expresses a relationship to another document outside of the originating HTML document.
<b>&lt;BASE HREF="url"&gt;</b>	Allows an HTML document to make the correct interpretation of URLs in a document.
<b>&lt;BASEFONT&gt;</b>	Sets the font style and size for an entire document.
<b>&lt;BIG&gt;&lt;/BIG&gt;</b>	Increases the size of a font.
<b>&lt;SMALL&gt;&lt;/SMALL&gt;</b>	Decreases the size of a font.
<b>&lt;STRONG&gt;&lt;/STRONG&gt;</b>	Places strong emphasis on text.
<b>&lt;SUB&gt;&lt;/SUB&gt;</b>	Defines subscripts.
<b>&lt;SUP&gt;&lt;/SUP&gt;</b>	Defines superscripts.
<b>&lt;B&gt;&lt;/B&gt;</b>	Makes text bold.
<b>&lt;I&gt;&lt;/I&gt;</b>	Makes text italic.
<b>&lt;U&gt;&lt;/U&gt;</b>	Underlines text.
<b>&lt;EM&gt;&lt;/EM&gt;</b>	Places emphasis on text.
<b>&lt;PRE&gt;&lt;/PRE&gt;</b>	Preformatted text.
<b>&lt;CITE&gt;&lt;/CITE&gt;</b>	Encloses citations.

<code>&lt;CODE&gt;&lt;/CODE&gt;</code>	Encloses code-based text.
<code>&lt;SAMP&gt;&lt;/SAMP&gt;</code>	Displays sample text.
<code>&lt;KBD&gt;&lt;/KBD&gt;</code>	Encloses keyboard input.
<code>&lt;PLAINTEXT&gt;&lt;/PLAINTEXT&gt;</code>	Disables the <code>&lt;FONT&gt;</code> tag process.
<code>&lt;VAR&gt;&lt;/VAR&gt;</code>	Indicates a variable.
<code>&lt;DFN&gt;&lt;/DFN&gt;</code>	Indicates a definition.
<code>&lt;ABBR&gt;&lt;/ABBR&gt;</code>	Indicates an abbreviation.
<code>&lt;ACRONYM&gt;&lt;/ACRONYM&gt;</code>	Indicates an acronym.
<code>&lt;TT&gt;&lt;/TT&gt;</code>	Displays a fixed width font.
<code>&lt;P&gt;&lt;/P&gt;</code>	Begins and ends a paragraph.
<code>&lt;DIV ALIGN="value"&gt;&lt;/DIV&gt;</code>	Aligns a specific area of text.
<code>&lt;HR&gt;</code>	Draws a horizontal line across the web page.
<code>&lt;BR&gt;</code>	Creates a line break within a Web page.
<code>&lt;FORM&gt;&lt;/FORM&gt;</code>	Begins a form within an HTML document.
<code>&lt;TABLE&gt;&lt;/TABLE&gt;</code>	Begins a table within an HTML document.
<code>&lt;TR&gt;&lt;/TR&gt;</code>	Creates a row within a table. Must be used after the <code>&lt;TABLE&gt;</code> tag.
<code>&lt;TD&gt;&lt;/TD&gt;</code>	Creates a column within a row. Must be used after the <code>&lt;TR&gt;</code> tag.
<code>&lt;TH&gt;&lt;/TH&gt;</code>	Creates a heading cell. Used in place of the <code>&lt;TD&gt;</code> tag.
